**NOTE:** Members enrolled in Dairy Goats & Meat Goats may also exhibit items in Dept. 10, Class A. These are Vet Science non-animal items.

Refer to the Animal Health Regulations for Fairs and Shows in Wisconsin for current identification requirements for goats. Exhibitor is responsible for correct identification on each goat and completing the Animal Id and Check-In Form accurately. Goats not meeting the requirements cannot be allowed to participate or even remain in the barn.

Judging will begin with Showmanship (Senior, Intermediate and Junior) followed by breeds. Show schedule will be posted in the barn. Grand Champion Showmanship winner in each group will have the opportunity to participate in the Round Robin Showmanship competition, Sunday at 4 PM.

A Herdsmanship Award will be given to the club with the overall highest score based on general appearance and neatness of exhibit; storage of feed and equipment; decorations that are well presented with complete information and education; and members presence. Herdsmanship Awards are presented at the Round Robin Showmanship Competition, Sunday at 4 PM.

**ANIMAL EXHIBIT RULES:**

1. Goats with full natural horns may not be entered unless full natural horns are a standard for a specific breed. Dairy Goats may not have horns.
2. Any dairy doe 24 months of age or over that has never freshened may not be shown.
3. All animals will be checked by superintendents prior to unloading, during the fair entry times. Animals must be in good health, appear on the Animal Vet ID Check-In form and be correctly identified
4. All exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after themselves and their animals.

    - Clothes and person neat and clean; appropriate dress
  3. CARE OF THE EXHIBIT.....40%
    - Goats clean, trimmed
    - Aisles clean
    - Equipment, tack and feed stored neatly and areas clean
