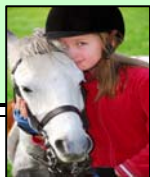


DEPARTMENT 6 JUNIOR HORSES



(Danish and Regular Judging)

NOTE: Members enrolled in Horse/Horseless Horse may also exhibit items in Dept. 10, Class A. These are Vet Science non-animal items.

REGULATIONS:

- List the name of your horse behind each class on the fair entry blank. In addition to submitting the form to the Extension Office, mail a copy of the entry form to Sally McCann, N4814 Linse Rd, West Salem, WI 54669**
- All 4-H horses & ponies, including horseless horse, must be registered by May 1 of the exhibit year. In case of horse injury or illness, contact county leader.
- All exhibitors must attend ONE project meeting, ONE clinic with their horse, and choice of ONE 4-H horse clinic, educational event, or project meeting. PLUS: EACH FAMILY WILL BE REQUIRED TO CONTRIBUTE A MINIMUM OF FOUR (4) HOURS AT A FUND RAISING EVENT, in order to exhibit at the Fair.**
- Exhibitors may show animals that they own or manage. A managerial animal means the horse/pony is under the care of the exhibitor, except in horseless horse classes.
- No stallions may be shown, except weanlings.
- Member classes will be according to current or just completed school grade.
- Health records are required on animals coming to fair. Horses are not permitted to enter unless they are in good state of health and do not show evidence of contagious or infectious disease. Horses with contagious or infectious disease will be ordered to be removed from the fairgrounds. All horses entering the fairgrounds must be accompanied by a report of a negative test result based on an approved test for equine infectious anemia (Coggins test) conducted since January 1 of the exhibit year at a state or federal laboratory, except for a nursing foal accompanying its dam with a negative test result. Exhibitor must present original and have a copy for the show committee to keep.
- ALL riding classes (including English, western, driving and games) require SEI approved hard hats with safety harness securely fastened. All exhibitors riding or driving outside show arenas are also required to wear SEI approved helmets. Helmets are not required for halter & showmanship classes.
- Proper attire must be worn in the show ring.
WESTERN: **Hard hat** (or hat for showmanship/halter) boots, long pants, long sleeve shirt (button down) belt
ENGLISH: **Hard hat**, coat, pants, boots
GAMES: **Hard hat**, long sleeve shirt, long pants, boots
DRIVING: **Hard hat**, clean, neat and appropriate clothing
For safety reasons, no slip on spurs
- Each animal may be entered in a maximum of four state qualifying classes which are Classes F, G, H, I, J, K, L, M, & N.
ONE equitation OR driving reinsmanship
ONE pleasure OR pleasure driving
ONE showmanship
ONE trail
A maximum of two animals may be entered by a single exhibitor. A third animal may be brought in for Games, Jumping, or Miscellaneous classes. Unlimited entries are allowed in Jumping, Games and Miscellaneous classes. All ponies may be measured at check-in. Any animal over 56" must be entered in horse classes.
- Members of the immediate family may use the same project horse and show the horse in one pleasure, two equitation, two showmanship classes and one trail class. The horse can be shown only once in a specific class number.

- Exhibitor may enter EITHER Horseless Horse OR Beginning Classes - NOT BOTH.
- Horses entered in Green Horse (Class O, Items 9 & 10) may NOT be entered in any other canter class. These horses may enter halter and/or showmanship classes on Saturday.
- The same horse may be used by no more than two members in any item in Jumping, Games or Miscellaneous.
- Any exhibitor receiving a blue ribbon may show in the championship category. An exhibitor may show one horse or pony in each championship category.
- Horses must be on the fairgrounds no later than 5:00 p.m. Wednesday and remain in place until 6:00 p.m. Sunday. Early removal from the grounds, for other than veterinary reasons, will result in forfeiture of State Expo eligibility and may result in the loss of fair premiums. The superintendent must notify the La Crosse County Ag Society for permission and approval.
- Ponies may be required to be measured. Any animal over 56" will be entered in horse classes.
- Show management reserves the right to combine classes with three or fewer entries; however, judging will be separate.
- NO ADDITIONAL ENTRIES WILL BE MADE AT THE FAIR FOR CLASSES A – N. Class O signups will be on Sunday.
- 4-H Horse Project members voted that good sportsmanship suggests that once an exhibitor qualifies his/her animal for the State 4-H Horse Expo, he/she will drop one or more additional state-qualifying class with that animal.
- State 4-H Horse Expo Eligibility: Exhibitor must be in grades 6 - 13 of the exhibit year and have received a blue in any State 4-H Horse Expo qualifying classes which are Classes F, G, H, I, J, K, L, M, and N (excluding beginner classes). Exhibitors who qualify must attend a meeting held at 5:00 p.m. on Sunday of fair week for State 4-H Horse Expo entries and guidelines.
- Only the exhibitor is allowed to ride, drive or school the horse.
- Grand champion showmanship winner in each age group will participate in Round Robin Showmanship competition Sunday, 4 p.m.

CLASS A – MODEL HORSES

ELIGIBILITY:

Exhibitor must be 4-H horse/pony or horseless horse project member for the current year.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- Models must be brought to the New Youth Building on Tuesday, 5 p.m. The exhibitor **MUST BE PRESENT** to show his/her model. The Model Horse Show will begin at 5 p.m. It is optional whether to take models home after the show or to leave models for display after the Model Horse Show.
- A single model may show in more than one class.
- Each model must have an entry tag fastened to a hind leg that cannot easily be removed. A string tag may be used.
- Required information on the entry tag: Exhibitor's name, address, and age on one side and breed of model on the other side.
- Classes 8-13 require a 3"x5" card explaining what the model is doing.
- No entry changes made at show.
- Model need NOT be a Breyer to participate.
